

## Jesus' Job Is To Help Us

In the 4 Gospels, we see Jesus helping people that were going through major problems in their lives. He is the same now as He was back then. He will help you, if you believe He will. The reason I'm writing this letter today is because I know so many people that have been given bad reports from the doctors. When these reports come to them, they can produce fear; which is the opposite of faith. We must not let the devil paint images of the bad reports coming to pass in our lives. In this Newsletter, we will show you different accounts of people that needed Jesus' help; and He never turned any of them down, when they believed He would help them. Please study these accounts, and think about Jesus doing it for you like He did it for them.

Hebrews 13:8 KJV Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever.

Matthew 8:2-3 KJV And, behold, there came a leper and worshipped Him, saying, Lord, if Thou wilt, Thou canst make me clean. [3] And Jesus put forth His hand, and touched him, saying, I will; be thou clean. And immediately his leprosy was cleansed.

Matthew 8:5-10,13 KJV And when Jesus was entered into Capernaum, there came unto Him a centurion, beseeching Him, [6] And saying, Lord, my servant lieth at home sick of the palsy, grievously tormented. [7] And Jesus saith unto him, I will come and heal him. [8] The centurion answered and said, Lord, I am not worthy that Thou shouldest come under my roof: but speak the Word only, and my servant shall be healed. [9] For I am a man under authority, having soldiers under me: and I say to this man, Go, and he goeth; and to another, Come, and he cometh; and to my servant, Do this, and he doeth it. [10] When Jesus heard it, He marvelled, and said to them that followed, Verily I say unto you, I have not found so great faith, no, not in Israel. [13] And Jesus said unto the centurion, Go thy way; and as thou hast believed, so be it done unto thee. And his servant was healed in the selfsame hour.

Matthew [8:14-15](#) KJV And when Jesus was come into Peter's house, He saw his wife's mother laid, and sick of a fever. [15] And He touched her hand, and the fever left her: and she arose, and ministered unto them.

Matthew [8:16-17](#) KJV When the even was come, they brought unto Him many that were possessed with devils: and He cast out the spirits with His Word, and healed all that were sick: [17] That it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Esaias the prophet, saying, Himself took our infirmities, and bare our sicknesses.

Mark 7:25-29 KJV For a certain woman, whose young daughter had an unclean spirit, heard of Him, and came and fell at His feet: [26] The woman was a Greek, a Syrophenician by nation; and she besought Him that He would cast forth the devil out of her daughter. [27] But Jesus said unto her, Let the children first be filled: for it is not meet to take the children's bread, and to cast it unto the dogs. [28] And she answered and said unto Him, Yes, Lord: yet the dogs under the table eat of the children's crumbs. [29] And He said unto her, For this saying go thy way; the devil is gone out of thy daughter.

Mark 5:22-24,35-43 KJV And, behold, there cometh one of the rulers of the synagogue, Jairus by name; and when he saw Him, he fell at His feet, [23] And besought Him greatly, saying, My little daughter lieth at the point of death: I pray thee, come and lay Thy hands on her, that she may be healed; and she shall live. [24] And Jesus went with him; and much people followed Him, and thronged Him. [35] While he yet spake, there came from the ruler of the synagogue's house certain which said, Thy daughter is dead: why troublest thou the Master any further? [36] As soon as Jesus heard the word that was spoken, He saith unto the ruler of the synagogue, Be not afraid, only believe. [37] And He suffered no man to follow Him, save Peter, and James, and John the brother of James.

[38] And He cometh to the house of the ruler of the synagogue, and seeth the tumult, and them that wept and wailed greatly. [39] And when He was come in, He saith unto them, Why make ye this ado, and weep? the damsel is not dead, but sleepeth. [40] And they laughed Him to scorn. But when He had put them all out, He taketh the father and the mother of the damsel, and them that were with Him, and entereth in where the damsel was lying. [41] And He took the damsel by the hand, and said unto her, Talitha cumi; which is, being interpreted, Damsel, I say unto thee, arise. [42] And straightway the damsel arose, and walked; for she was of the age of twelve years. And they were astonished with a great astonishment. [43] And He charged them straitly that no man should know it; and commanded that something should be given her to eat.

In all these accounts, we see Jesus helping people that believe He will help them. We must not let the devil convince us that Jesus will not help us. The character of Jesus is a character of healing and helping. If we truly come to Jesus believing He will help us, we will see His power go to work for us.

I leave you with this; the devil will try to tell you that you don't deserve Jesus' help, so don't expect it. He is right about not deserving it, but remember none of us deserve anything from Jesus; He chose to give it to us freely.
