

The Magnificent Holy Spirit

Isaiah 61:1-3 AMP THE SPIRIT of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed and qualified me to preach the Gospel of good tidings to the meek, the poor, and afflicted; He has sent me to bind up and heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the physical and spiritual captives and the opening of the prison and of the eyes to those who are bound, (2) To proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord the year of His favor and the day of vengeance of our God, to comfort all who mourn, [3] To grant consolation and joy to those who mourn in Zion--to give them an ornament (a garland or diadem) of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of joy instead of mourning, the garment expressive of praise instead of a heavy, burdened, and failing spirit--that they may be called oaks of righteousness lofty, strong, and magnificent, distinguished for uprightness, justice, and right standing with God, the planting of the Lord, that He may be glorified.

Notice in these verses that when the Holy Spirit comes upon us, and is allowed to operate; liberty, freedom and healing come every time! He is the third part of the Godhead and has been given to us as a Gift. When things are not right, if the Holy Ghost shows up, His power is better than Superman. One reason Christians fail to accomplish what God asks them to do is that they leave out the Person that will cause them to succeed - the Holy Spirit. His mission is to fill believers so that they can perform the duties and acts God asks them to do. He doesn't just do things on His own; He is the helper, He assists the Church. He empowers them to do what they can't do on their own.

About 30 years ago, I started studying the Holy Spirit. The more I saw His person in the Bible and allowed Him to fill my life, the more things started changing for the good. I've watched Him perform wonderful healings and deliverances since that day. So today I want to encourage you to study the Holy Spirit in your Bible. Go to your concordance and find all the references to the Holy Spirit. As you study Him, you will start experiencing His Presence filling you. You will hear His voice prompting you to step out and do things that are extraordinary.

Now, let me talk to you about the Holy Spirit being a person. How awesome and how wonderful He is; having abilities that go beyond our comprehension. There's no comparison between His abilities and that of a human, but let me talk to you about one person's ability that we know - Henry Ford. He was a man that had big dreams. He saw mankind driving cars all across America. He believed he could mass-produce these automobiles and change the very way of life for the American people. Sure enough it happened. America, has inspired the nations of the world with our manufacturing capabilities. They say Henry Ford is one of the first people that caused this way of thinking to transpire. If Henry Ford could dream big and accomplish these magnificent things, what could a person do that is filled with the Holy Spirit? Remember the Holy Spirit is limitless!

If we look at Jesus' earthly ministry and watch all of the supernatural things He did, we see it all happened because He was filled with His Father's Spirit. As born-again Christians, we have that same Spirit in us; and we can do greater things than we can imagine or think, if we focus on the One that is all-powerful - the Holy Spirit.

Will you join me in prayer tonight for our Church services tomorrow; that we will experience great manifestations of the Holy Spirit? Through our faith and prayers, He

will manifest His power to heal and help those that are bound. Remember that Sunday is not just like other days, it is a special day when people arrive at Church across the world and will be changed forever by the power of the Holy Spirit. Many will be born again, filled with the Holy Spirit, and many will be delivered from all kinds of addictions. God chose it to be a day when His family would join together and have sweet fellowship. Don't let the devil stop you from coming to Church tomorrow.
