

## God Our Father

God, the Creator of everything, desired something more valuable to Him than any material thing. He desired children that He could pour His love upon. When we receive Jesus as our Savior, we don't just have our sins blotted out - we have a new Father; and He is God!

**Hebrews 2:10-11 NCV** God is the One who made all things, and all things are for His glory. He wanted to have many children share His glory, so He made the One who leads people to salvation perfect through suffering. [11] Jesus, Who makes people holy, and those who are made holy are from the same family. So He is not ashamed to call them His brothers and sisters.

In these two verses, God reveals to us His glorious plan. Nobody can ever comprehend in their natural, human mind what God does for them when He receives them into His family. We have to let the Holy Spirit reveal it to us a little bit at a time.

In **Ephesians 3:8 AMP**, the apostle Paul says this to us...To me, though I am the very least of all the saints (God's consecrated people), this grace (favor, privilege) was granted and graciously entrusted: to proclaim to the Gentiles the unending (boundless, fathomless, incalculable, and exhaustless) riches of Christ [wealth which no human being could have searched out],

What we have received, by coming into the Family of God the Father and Jesus, is just too great for us to understand in our natural minds. But, once the Holy Spirit reveals this glorious secret to us, it will change our way of thinking and living forever. It will also help us in our believing to receive what God has promised us. Confidence to receive from someone generally comes from the relationship you have with them. It is the same with God. Let's look at a couple of verses that give us insight on this subject.

**Galatians 4:6-7 KJV** And because ye are sons, God hath sent forth the Spirit of His Son into your hearts, crying, [Abba](#), Father. [7] Wherefore thou art no more a servant, but a son; and if a son, then an heir of God through Christ.

We are never to think of ourselves as just God's servants again. If you're a servant, you own nothing in the relationship. In these verses, He calls us sons and heirs of God. For years I've been watching my Father God show up in my life and do things I could never do on my own. I believe the reason He has done this is because I learned this revelation right at the beginning of my walk with the Lord.

I believe God wants us to let these verses burn in our consciousness.
